Happy Hollow Zooteens Donate Over \$18,000 to Support San Jose Police Department Canine Unit

San José - On Tuesday, January 30, Happy Hollow Park and Zoo's Zooteen program formally donated over \$18,000 to the San Jose Police Department to purchase ballistic vests for their canine officers.

The money was raised through Happy Hollow's non-profit organization, Happy Hollow Corporation, which supports the operation of the Vesta Dog program at Happy Hollow. Happy Hollow's teen volunteers, called Zooteens, started a local chapter of Vesta Dogs in 2004 and fundraised the money with the purpose of protecting the dogs of the San Jose Police Department's Canine Unit.

At Happy Hollow, Zooteens teach the public about global animal issues, and through this project they were able to take direct action and support animals locally. Through educational booths, donation boxes, partnerships with other community organizations and with the support of the officers of the San Jose canine unit, they raised over \$23,400. They have purchased one ballistic canine vest for the Capitola Police Dept., two for the East Palo Alto Police Dept. and four vests for the San Jose Police Dept. Today's donation of \$18,883 will allow the police department to purchase twelve more vests as needed in the future.
