History San José, Happy Hollow Park & Zoo and the San Jose Giants are partnering to offer family movie nights. On Saturday, September 29th the movie, *E.T.: The Extra-Terrestrial* begins at 7 p.m. and gates open at 6 p.m. Admission and parking are free.

Hit a homerun with the kids, figuratively speaking, and bring the whole family to watch together at Movie Night at the San Jose Giants Municipal Stadium, just across the street from Kelley Park. The delicious and famous San Jose Giants barbecue will be available and snack concessions will be open during the movie.

The original 1982 movie will be shown on the jumbo-tron screen at the stadium. Moviegoers may watch from their own blanket in the outfield with a picnic or from the comfort of stadium seats in the grandstands.

“Everyone remembers “phone home,” said Alida Bray, CEO of History San José. “It has become part of the vernacular of pop culture these days.”

Also, the “E.T. Phone Home” promotion allows folks to bring old cellular phones for recycling and receive a Happy Hollow Park & Zoo admission pass and a coupon for a

free ice cream cone at O'Brien's Café at History Park. (Limit one admission pass and ice cream coupon per person.)

“We love the idea of a Family Movie Night for the community, and to also tie into one of our conservation efforts -- even better!” said Gregg Owens, Zoo Manager.

San Jose Giants Municipal Stadium is located at 588 East Alma Avenue at Senter Road, in San José, CA 95112, just across the street from Kelley Park, which contains Happy Hollow Park & Zoo, History Park and the Japanese Friendship Gardens.

*Chairs are not allowed in the outfield, but blankets are welcome. No RSVP is required--first come first served. No alcohol may be brought into the stadium.
